**MINUTES OF THE 3RD REGULAR SESSION OF THE SANGGUNIANG PANLUNGSOD
(15th CITY COUNCIL) OF PAGADIAN CITY HELD ON 16 JULY 2025 AT THE SP SESSION
HALL, 4th FLOOR CITY COMMERCIAL CENTER (C3) BUILDING, PAGADIAN CITY**

CALL TO ORDER:

Honorable Vice Mayor Monique Shaira Y. To, Presiding Officer, convened and officially called to order the 3rd Regular Session of the 15th City Council at 9:00 in the morning.

INVOCATION, SINGING OF THE PHILIPPINE NATIONAL ANTHEM AND RECITATION OF THE “PANUNUMPA SA WATAWAT NG PILIPINAS:

At the instance of the Floor Leader, Honorable Jackielyn Krystyl C. Bana, the session, accompanied by a prepared audio recording, commenced with the invocation, which was then followed by the mass singing of the Philippine National Anthem, the recitation of the “Panunumpa sa Watawat ng Pilipinas,” the singing of the “Zamboanga del Sur March” and the “Pagadian City Hymn.”

ROLL CALL AND DETERMINATION OF QUORUM:

A roll call was made at the direction of the Chair and quorum was then declared with the attendance of eight (8) Council Members namely: Honorable Vice Mayor Monique Shaira Y. To, Honorable Roger L. Acedillo, Honorable Jackielyn Krystyl C. Bana, Honorable Ann Marjorie N. Revelo, Honorable Maphilindo Q. Obaob, Honorable Bienvenido C. Culve, Honorable Ronald Christopher Glenn L. Ariosa and Honorable Joan Szanne S. Pulmones.

Sometime later on during the course of the proceeding, the presence of Honorable Lance Samuel F. Co, Honorable Ariel J. Lim, Jr., Honorable Patrisha Kaye N. Asugas and Honorable Marylynn U. Tan was recorded. The body also noted that Honorable Ma. Alicia Elena V. Ariosa was on leave.

READING AND APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE 2ND REGULAR SESSION:

At the instance of the Honorable Floor Leader, the body dispensed with the Reading of the Minutes of the 2nd Regular Session which was held on July 9, 2025. Thereafter, with the presentation of a formal motion for its approval and, with no discussions from the floor, the minutes was approved as presented.

FIRST READING & REFERRAL TO COMMITTEES:

The herein items calendared for First Reading and Referral to Committees were then taken up and acted upon accordingly, to wit:

1. Resolution No. 12, s. 2025 of Barangay White Beach, entitled: “A resolution requesting the 15th City Council to reconsider the retracting of the Sangguniang Panlungsod Resolution of the 14th City Council relative to the titling of the parcel of land located at Barangay White Beach for the reason of the failure to hold a public hearing for the purpose was first presented. Before the body proceeded to the discussion, the Chair declared a recess for an informal discussion.

Upon resumption, the Honorable Presiding Officer informed the body that the action of the Barangay Council of White Beach was an offshoot of a resolution passed during the 14th City Council, per recommendation of the Committee on Planning and Landed Estates, which in gist, authorized the Honorable City Mayor to apply, for and in behalf of the City Government, for

land titling with the Department of Environment and Natural Resources–Community Environment and Natural Resources Offices (DENR-CENRO) in relation to parcel of public land located at Barangay White Beach, this city. At this point, Honorable Lim, Jr., in his capacity as the Chairperson of the Committee on Planning & Landed Estates during the previous Council, explained that the recommendation to pass Resolution No. 2025-1093 was anchored on the fact that there is an existing, alienable and disposable untitled parcel of land located at Barangay White Beach to which the City Government would like to apply for titling, such that he sought clarification whether supporting/additional documents were attach to the request of the Barangay Council, to which the Secretary to the Sanggunian responded that only the resolution was submitted and received by the office. Furthermore, he then stressed his assumption that there might be a conflict in the application for land titling of the said parcel of land, to which the Presiding Officer provided information that there are at least two hundred (200) households that will be affected. Honorable Ronald Christopher Glenn L. Ariosa, for his part and upon recognition, supported the suggestion of the other Council Members to refer the foregoing matter to the appropriate committee for the conduct of a public hearing.

A short recess was then declared to allow the Council Members discuss informally the matter and, upon resumption, the body resolved to jointly refer the same to the Committee on Laws, Rules & Policy Formulation, Committee on Human Rights & Urban/Rural Community, Committee on Planning & Landed Estates, and Committee on Barangay Affairs.

Corollary to the above-action, the body, at the instance of the Floor Leader and duly seconded, passed **Resolution No. 2025-0013**, holding in abeyance the dissemination/distribution of Resolution No. 2025-1093 enacted by the 14th City Council, entitled: “A resolution authorizing the Honorable City Mayor to apply, for and in behalf of the City Government, for land titling with the Department of Environment and Natural Resources–Community Environment and Natural Resources Office (DENR-CENRO) concerning a parcel of public land located at Barangay White Beach, this city,” pending review of this Sangguniang (15th City Council) in relation to the request of the Sangguniang Barangay of White Beach, as enunciated in its Resolution No. 12, series of 2025.

2. Next considered was Draft Resolution No. 006, sponsored by Honorable Bienvenido C. Culve, entitled: “A resolution requesting the Local Chief Executive to provide the list of personnel with their position composition of the Local School Board in Pagadian City.” Following the incorporation of amendment, the body, on motion of the proponent and duly seconded, resolved to approve the same through the passage of **Resolution No. 2025-0014**, requesting Honorable City Mayor Samuel S. Co, in his official capacity as Chairman of the Local School Board of Pagadian City, to convene and constitute, through an Executive Order, the Local School Board of Pagadian City pursuant to Section 98 of the Local Government Code, and provide/furnish the Sangguniang Panlungsod with a copy of the same for reference and guidance.
3. At this point, the body, following a short deliberation and, upon formal motion presented by the proponent and duly seconded, resolved to approve Draft Resolution No. 007, sponsored by Honorable Bienvenido C. Culve, entitled: “A resolution requesting the Local Chief Executive thru the Road Traffic Management Office (RTMO) to install appropriate traffic signs and

road marking to provide direction and information to all users,” through **Resolution No. 2025-0015**, earnestly requesting the Honorable City Mayor to direct the City Engineer, in collaboration with the Road Traffic Management Office (RTMO)–Office of the City Mayor, to urgently install and/or establish appropriate traffic signages and road markings in strategic locations within the city to ensure road safety and provide clear guidance to all road users.

4. Draft Resolution No. 008, sponsored by Honorable Bienvenido C. Culve, entitled: “A resolution requesting the City Mayor Honorable Mayor Samuel S. Co to provide the list of personnel with their position of the Roads and Traffic Planning Board in Pagadian City” was urgently treated. The body, in consideration of the manifestation of support from Honorable Obaob on the need to convene the said Board given that there is now a new Chairperson of the Committee on Public Utilities, Transportation, Communications and Franchising, with the suspension of the rules, passed **Resolution No. 2025-0016**, requesting Honorable City Mayor Samuel S. Co to convene and constitute, by way of an Executive Order, the Roads and Traffic Planning Board pursuant to the provisions of City Ordinance No. 2018-400, and provide/furnish the Sangguniang Panlungsod with a copy of the same for its reference and guidance.
5. With the rules still suspended, Draft Resolution No. 009, sponsored by Honorable Maphilindo Q. Obaob, entitled: “A resolution requesting the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) 1st Engineering District, to submit an evaluation report regarding the operation of PAMANA (Private Water Supply Company) on their undertaking activities along the National Highway, in aid of legislation” was urgently considered.

Initially, Honorable Obaob, upon recognition, justified the foregoing request where he described the DPWH, in relation to the implementation/maintenance of public works in the national road, as very strict that even a small crack or hole it will automatically demand from the contractor for replacement. In relation thereto, he argued that the PAMANA, on the other hand, is regularly doing excavation works along the national highway and he then expressed apprehension that the restoration thereof might not be in conformity with the existing national engineering standards, protocols and statutory regulations governing the use of national roads. He further intimated the activities undertaken by the PAMANA has caused inconvenience to the riding public aside from posing great danger to the lives and limbs of the motorists and pedestrians.

Shortly thereafter and, following a brief deliberation, the body, on motion of the proponent and duly seconded, approved the same through **Resolution No. 2025-0017**, earnestly requesting the District Engineer—First Engineering District of Zamboanga del Sur, Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH), to provide/furnish the Sangguniang Panlungsod (15th City Council) with an evaluation report on the excavation and restoration activities undertaken by PAMANA, a private water utility provider, along the national highway within the jurisdiction of Pagadian City, in aid of legislation.

6. The body suspended the rules to urgently consider Draft Resolution No. 010, sponsored by Honorable Maphilindo Q. Obaob, entitled: “A resolution strongly recommending to the Local Finance Committee, through the Honorable City Mayor, to prioritize the inclusion in the CY 2026 Local Expenditure Program of the City Government the funding, under priority development projects, the following infrastructure projects, as specified hereunder. Following a short discussion, the body, upon formal motion

presented by the proponent and duly seconded, resolved to approve the same through the passage of **Resolution No. 2025-0018**, strongly recommends to the Local Finance Committee, through the Honorable City Mayor, to prioritize the following infrastructure development projects for inclusion in the Calendar Year 2026 Local Expenditure Program of the City Government under the Priority Development Projects, to wit:

- ✓ Construction of a comprehensive drainage system in the low-lying barangays of Pagadian City, particularly in Barangays Sta. Lucia, Santiago, San Pedro, Dumagoc, Balangasan, Lumbia, Tuburan, and Tiguma;
 - ✓ Rehabilitation and development of a public cemetery;
 - ✓ Construction of an alternative road from Purok Subida, Barangay Dao, to the upper portion of Barangay Banale.
7. A referral to the Committee on Finance & Appropriations was made for the endorsed Revised Supplemental Annual Investment Program (SAIP) No. 1 for Calendar Year 2025 of the City Government of Pagadian, in the amount of P286,944,700.00, together with CDC Resolution No. 02-A, s. 2025, adopting the same.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

With the presence now of the invited resource persons in the plenary, the body then suspended the sequential treatment of the agenda and proceeded to tackle the lone item of the agenda under Unfinished Business which was the concern of the Honorable Members (Honorable Ariel J. Lim) relative to the highly publicized riot incident involving groups of young individuals which took place at San Francisco District, this city.

Following the suspension of the rules, the body, after Honorable Lim, Jr. gave a brief background on the matter, then recognized LTCOL Jerwin SD Cagurin, Chief of Police, to provide an update on the incident of riots in the city.

Consequently, LTCOL Cagurin reported two (2) sensational riot incidents in the city which went viral. Accordingly, the first was last June 15, 2025, which took place at the vicinity of Dose Pharmacy and Convenience Store, Barangay San Francisco. However, after conducting investigation it was revealed that such incident is not considered a riot as there were only two (2) persons involved in a fist fight but the other customers were seen throwing bottles in the street purposely to stop and separate them. He also intimated that up to the present the persons involved never reported to the station regarding the incident. As to the second incident, it happened last July 2, 2025 at the Katribu Restobar wherein the troublemaker was a passerby who initiated a fight with a group who were drinking at the bar and it escalated into a riot when others joined in to help the unidentified victim being beaten up. Furthermore, he averred that the suspect was identified as having a previous case of theft, and is noted to be involved with a group of thieves who usually loiter along the boulevard.

In response to the manifestation presented by Honorable Lim, Jr., LTCOL Cagurin presented the following suggestions/recommendations, viz: a) requiring big establishments to hire security personnel to regulate customer spillover to outside the establishment and not just leave it to the PNP personnel to implement crowd control; and b) the City Government should put up additional CCTVs particularly in all public places. On the query posed by Honorable Lim, Jr.,

he confirmed that minors were spotted in some bar establishments, however, he categorically stated that they are not involved in riots.

During the discussion, Honorable Revelo, having been informed that there is an existing ordinance prohibiting drinking of liquor in public places, suggested to look into the business permits of the establishment to determine whether a convenience store is allowed to operate as a bar during nighttime. She further alleged that this situation contributes to noise pollution due to the loud music.

Honorable Co, for his part, enlightened the body on the distinction between an armed security guard which is commonly employed in establishments and a bouncer, where he cited the provisions of Republic Act No. 5487, such that in cases of conflict, a single guard may not be sufficient, especially in large establishments. Honorable Pulmones, upon recognition, suggested to refer the concerns brought out by the individual Council Members to the appropriate committee for possible strengthening and review of existing ordinances in relation to the issuance of business permits particularly on the issue of selling liquor and cigarettes to minors. She also gave an assurance of the Liga ng mga Barangay's commitment to help in the implementation.

With no further discussions from the Council Members, LTCOL Cagurin then informed the body that the Pagadian City Police Station was recently recognized and awarded as the Top Performing Component City Police Station in Region IX. Thereafter, the Honorable Presiding Officer expressed thanks as she congratulates the City PNP for their accomplishments and she added some points to be included as to the prevention, namely: to put hotlines in every establishment, installation of CCTVs and closely monitor the selling of liquor to minors.

Next recognized was Ms. Evangeline Poquita, City Social Welfare and Development Officer. Preliminarily, she reported on the matter concerning their office action in the rescuing at least 145 street children and children on street where it was found out that 16 of those were using rugby solvent and 3 of which are now in Bahay Pag-asa and 2 where turned-over to their families. She also contended that the curfew under the Children's Code was not yet implemented due to lack of the Implementing Rules & Regulations (IRR) as the Technical Working Group who will be responsible in the drafting of the IRR has not yet been convened and constituted as they are still awaiting the City DepEd to submit the name of the PTA President before the City Mayor may issue an Executive Order for the purpose.

During the discussion, Ms. Poquita noted the suggestion made by Honorable Bana for the social worker to take the lead in the operation to rescue minors from the street considering the minor's vulnerability and to ensure that the rights of the minor is protected. On her query if there are enough personnel at CSWD, Ms. Poquita disclosed that there are only six (6) regular employees at the CSWD while the rest are casuals or job orders however she already brought up this matter to the City Chief Executive to hire more social workers to complement the office responsibilities. On the issue concerning the matter on how the barangays can help in the implementation of curfew for minors as well as in the rescue of street children, Ms. Poquita suggested, if possible, for barangays to include in their respective budget the hiring and/or appointment of female social workers to respond during rescue operation of minors.

At this juncture, Honorable Obaob inquired on the status and physical condition of Bahay Pag-asa, where he revealed his previous experience relative to an apprehended minor of a crime of robbery who was confined at the City's Bahay Pag-Asa but information has it that the said minor later escaped, to which he expressed concern on the action of the minor particularly on the matter of climbing fences might cause injury to the escapee which will result to the liability of the City Government. He also lamented the non-implementation of the curfew ordinance considering that it is provided already in the ordinance the offices who shall implement the provisions thereof. Ms. Poquita, in response thereto, clarified that they had already secured funding of P2-million for the improvement of the Bahay Pag-Asa including the installation of barb wire and CCTVs, as she further gave assurance that all concerns brought out by Honorable Obaob is well taken.

Following a lengthy discussion, the body, in support of the suggestion of Honorable Asugas, resolved to refer the matter jointly to the Committee on Police, Fire & Public Safety; Committee on Commerce, Trade & Industry & Economic Enterprise & Cooperatives; Committee on Women & Family Welfare; and Committee on Barangay Affairs. Thereafter, a brief recess was declared by the Chair for a photo op.

OTHER MATTERS:

With the suspension of the sequential treatment still in effect, the body considered to treat items calendared under Other Matters, the herein actions were recorded as unanimously adopted by the body to officially dispose of the items, to wit:

1. First treated was the endorsed Re-Appointment of Engr. Joseph Isaias M. Quipot VI, for the position of City Government Department Head 1 (City Administrator), SG-25/3, this City, for concurrence as mandated under R.A. 7160 (Local Government Code of 1991).

Following the suspension of the rules, the appointee, Engr. Quipot VI was recognized who then presented himself for the body's interpellation. After satisfactorily answered the queries posed by the individual Council Members, and finding him to have met the minimum requirements set under the Rules and Regulations of the Civil Service Commission, the body, on motion made by Honorable Obaob and duly seconded, resolved to adopt **Resolution No. 2025-0019**, confirming the appointment of Engr. Joseph Isaias M. Quipot VI as City Government Department Head I (City Administrator) effective July 1, 2025.

2. For the endorsed Re-Appointment of Atty. Georgina L. Ariosa-Lopez, for the position of City Government Department Head 1 (City Legal Officer), SG-25/1, this City, for concurrence as mandated under R.A. 7160 (Local Government Code of 1991), the body, with the rules still suspended and, upon formal motion made by Honorable Obaob and duly seconded, resolved to pass **Resolution No. 2025-0020**, confirming the appointment of Atty. Georgina L. Ariosa-Lopez as City Government Department Head I (City Legal Officer) effective July 1, 2025.

FIRST READING AND REFERRAL TO COMMITTEES, CONTINUED:

At this point, the body then lifted the suspension of the sequential treatment of the agenda and, unanimously continue to approve the consideration of the herein

issues and concerns under First Reading and Referral to Committee, these concerns were then accorded the following actions, viz:

1. The endorsed Supplemental Budget No. 1, for Calendar Year 2025, of the City Government of Pagadian, involving the amount of Two Hundred Eighty-Six Million Nine Hundred Forty-Four Thousand Seven Hundred Pesos (P286,944,700.00) was deemed referred to the Committee on Finance & Appropriations.
2. The following matters were simply noted and to be put on file, viz:
 - ✓ Resolution No. 3064-2025 from the Sangguniang Panlalawigan of Zamboanga del Sur, entitled: “Adopting *in toto* the findings and recommendation embodied in Committee Report No. 1800-2025 dated 18 June 2025 of the Committee on Trade and Industry, thereby declaring valid City Ordinance No. 2025-606, dated April 2025 of Pagadian City, Zamboanga del Sur, entitled: “An Ordinance Mandating Businesses Operating Within Pagadian City To Secure Philippine National Police (PNP) Certificate Of Conformity And/Or Certificate Of Distributorship Before Manufacturing, Selling, Using, Or Distributing PNP Uniforms, Insignias, And Other Accoutrements And Prescribing Penalties For Violations Thereof.”
 - ✓ Resolution No. 3073-2025 from the Sangguniang Panlalawigan of Zamboanga del Sur, entitled: “Declaring Valid City Ordinance No. 2024-598, entitled: “An Ordinance Institutionalizing the Program on Awards and Incentives for Service Excellence (PRAISE) in the City Government of Pagadian.
 - ✓ Resolution No. 3074-2025 from the Sangguniang Panlalawigan of Zamboanga del Sur, entitled: “Declaring valid City Ordinance No. 2025-599 dated January 8, 2025 of Pagadian City, Zamboanga del Sur, entitled: “An Ordinance Approving The Temporary Closure Of J. Ariosa Street Specifically (Fronting Santo Niño Cathedral) From Corners Cabrera And Sanson Streets, To Vehicular Traffic During The Following Dates And Time, To Wit: January 10–18, 2025 From 1:00 O’clock In The Afternoon Up To 10:00 O’clock In The Evening; January 19, 2025 From 1:00 O’clock In The Morning Up To 10:00 O’clock In The Evening; In Connection With The Weeklong Celebration Of The Annual Feast Of Señor Santo Niño.”
 - ✓ The letter-reply from Engr. Pablo O. Escudero, District Engineer, Department of Public Works and Highways, 1st Engineering District, acknowledging receipt of SP Resolution No. 2025-1104, entitled: “A resolution earnestly requesting the Honorable City Mayor to make the necessary representation with the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH)–First Engineering District of Zamboanga del Sur to immediately undertake road rehabilitation and repair of the damaged portion of Jose P. Rizal Avenue particularly near Camp Major Reginaldo C. Abelon, Lumbia District, this city.
 - ✓ On the highly publicized riot incident involving groups of young individuals that took place in the public road fronting one of the business establishments situated at Barangay San Francisco last June 14, 2025. The said incident resulted in injuries, damage to properties and widespread

fear among the nearby residents and her proposal for the conduct of an inquiry and come up with appropriate recommendation to prevent it from happening again.

3. A joint referral was made to the Committee on Infrastructure, Public Bidding & Community Development and Committee on Police, Fire & Public Safety for the issue on persistent flooding occurring in the city more particularly in the low-lying areas and the need for a whole-of-the-government approach to address the matter.
4. The letter from an anonymous concerned citizen requesting for an investigation pertaining to the construction of a building situated at Barangay Santiago, this city, which allegedly violating provisions of the National Building Code was jointly referred to the Committee on Infrastructure, Public Bidding & Community Development, Committee on Laws, Rules & Policy Formulation, and Committee on Police, Fire & Public Safety.
5. The unnumbered Draft Ordinance, authored by Honorable Asugas, entitled: “An Ordinance Providing For The Prevention, Control, And Mitigation Of Zoonotic And Non-Zoonotic Transboundary Animal Diseases, Prescribing Penalties For Violation, And Protecting Public Health And Economic Stability In The City Of Pagadian,” was subjected to a referral to the Committee on Agriculture, Fishery and Agrarian Reform, Committee on Laws, Rules & Policy Formulation and Committee on Health & Social Services.
6. At this juncture, Resolution No. 09-2025 from the Liga ng mga Barangay sa Pilipinas, Pagadian City Chapter, as presented by Honorable Joan Szanne S. Pulmones, entitled: “A resolution respectfully requesting for a certified copy of the minutes of the Peace and Order Council (POC) meeting held at the Executive Function Hall on April 8, 2025 in relation to the issuance of POC Resolution No. 39 and E.O. No. 07, series of 2025” was considered urgent. In support of the manifestation of Honorable Obaob, the body, on motion by the Honorable Floor Leader and duly seconded, passed **Resolution No. 2025-0021**, requesting the Honorable City Mayor—in his capacity as Chairman of the Peace and Order Council—to direct the Secretariat of the Pagadian City Peace and Order Council to furnish the Sangguniang Panlungsod with a copy of the minutes of the Peace and Order Council meeting held on 08 April 2025, at the City Mayor’s Office Executive Function Hall.
7. The following matters were deemed referred to the Committee on Finance & Appropriations, to wit:
 - ✓ Endorsed Resolution No. 01, s. 2025 from the Sangguniang Kabataan of Barangay Tuburan, entitled: “A resolution approving the Sangguniang Kabataan (SK) Supplemental Budget No. 1, of Barangay Tuburan, Pagadian City for the Priority Programs, Projects, and Activities (PPA’s) related to Sports Development Activities.
 - ✓ Endorsed SK Resolution No. 01, s. 2025 from the Sangguniang Kabataan of Barangay Gubang, entitled: “A resolution approving the Sangguniang Kabataan (SK) Supplemental Budget No. 1, of Barangay Gubang, Pagadian City for the Priority Programs, Projects, and Activities (PPA’s) related to Sports Development Activities.

8. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means was the endorsed Machine Copy of Regional Office Memorandum Circular (ROMC) No. 2025-004 dated January 21, 2025 from Acting Regional Director Von Clinton W. Cordero, Bureau of Local Government Finance, Regional Office IX, re: Tax Amnesty on Real Property Taxes under Republic Act No. 12001 or the “Real Property Valuation and Assessment Reform Act.”
9. Resolution No. 03, s. 2025 from the Sangguniang Barangay of Sta. Lucia, entitled: “A resolution requesting the Honorable Sangguniang Panlungsod of Pagadian City to conduct an investigation on the alleged improper removal of vendors and stall owners from their stalls at the Agora Public Market in Barangay Sta. Lucia without due process was deemed referred to the Body acting as Committee of the Whole and calendar as Unfinished Business in the next session.

UNSCHEDULED COMMITTEE REPORT:

Presented before this august body is Joint Committee Report No. 001 from the Committee on Commerce, Trade & Industry & Economic Enterprise & Cooperatives and Committee on Finance & Appropriations, which was presented by Honorable Revelo, for Referral No. 15cc-0014 relative to the endorsed Board Resolution No. 11-05-01 of the Pagadian-ZDS Chamber of Commerce and Industry Foundation, Incorporated (PZCCIFI), which in gist sought the support, participation and partnership from the Local Government of Pagadian City in the hosting of the 2025 Business Week Celebration and the 2nd Zamboanga Peninsula Investment Conference (ZAMBOPEN ICON) slated on July 20-25, 2025 in Pagadian City, Zamboanga del Sur, with a request of the Honorable City Mayor for an authority to extend financial assistance in the amount of P350,000.00 chargeable against the account of Financial Assistance to Organizations. Following a short deliberation and, in support to the Committee’s recommendation, the body then resolved to adopt **Resolution No. 2025-0022**, authorizing the Honorable City Mayor to extend financial assistance in the amount of Three Hundred Fifty Thousand (P350,000.00) Pesos to the Pagadian City–Zamboanga del Sur Chamber of Commerce & Industry Foundation, Incorporated, (PZCCIFI), as City Government’s counterpart, for the hosting of the 2025 Business Week Celebration and the 2nd Zamboanga Peninsula Investment Conference (ZAMBOPEN ICON) on July 20-25, 2025 at Pagadian City, chargeable under the Account No. GAD-25-3000-F-a3, Financial Assistance to Organizations.

OTHER MATTERS, CONTINUED:

The body proceeded to consider the other documents calendared under Other Matters, the herein actions were recorded as unanimously adopted by the body to officially dispose of the items, to wit:

1. The Pro-Forma letter of Agreement from the Civil Aviation Authority of the Philippines (CAAP) with various national and local entities, relative to the creation and operation of the Airport Emergency Committee (AEC) of Pagadian Airport, to effectively manage and mitigate the impact of emergency conditions, with a request of the Honorable City Mayor for an authority to enter into the same was referred to the Committee on Laws, Rules & Policy Formulation.
2. For the concern of Honorable Ariel J. Lim, Jr., relative to the implementation and coordination of health programs by the Local Government Unit (LGU) of Pagadian, the Provincial LGU of Zamboanga del Sur and the Regional Office of

the Department of Health (DOH), and the need for a more harmonized and unified system of data management and health programming to ensure the effective and efficient delivery of basic health services, the body resolved to jointly refer the matter to the Committee on Health & Social Services and Oversight Committee.

UNSCHEDULED MATTERS:

In considering the concerns made by Council Members not included in the calendar of business, the herein actions were recorded as unanimously adopted by the body to officially dispose of the items, to wit:

1. The following concerns presented by Honorable Obaob was first treated, to wit:
 - ✓ On his motion to reconsider the earlier action of the body in simply noted and filed item F-5.6 was supported by the body. Thereafter, the matter was then retrieved and, upon his motion, the body resolved to refer instead Item F-5.6 to the Committee on Infrastructure, Public Bidding & Community Development.
 - ✓ On the issue pertaining to the information/data provided by the Philippine Red Cross–Zamboanga del Sur Chapter relative to the bloodletting activities covering the period from January 2025 up to June 2025 where it was revealed that at least ten (10) persons were confirmed as reactive Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) after testing, the body resolved to jointly refer the same to the Committee on Health & Social Services; Committee on Police, Fire & Public Safety; and Oversight Committee.
 - ✓ On the information that the Pagadian City Police Station was recognized and awarded as the Top Performing Component City Police Station in Region IX, and his proposal to express the body’s congratulations and commendation was supported by the body. Following the suspension of the rules to urgently consider the matter, the body, with no further discussion and, at his instance and duly seconded, resolved to approve the same through the passage of **Resolution No. 2025-0023**, conveying the body’s congratulations and commendation to the Pagadian City Police Station for being recognized and awarded as “The Top Performing Component City Police Station in the entire Region IX.
2. The concern presented by Honorable Tan relative to the forthcoming celebration of the Linggo ng Kabataan on August 12, 2025, and her information that the different activities for such celebration will start during the month of July 2025 to provide the Youth Council of the Pagadian City ample time to prepare for the different activities as well as raise necessary awareness regarding the said event, was simply noted and filed.

ADJOURNMENT:

With no more matters to discuss, the session was declared adjourned on motion of the Floor Leader, following the closing prayer led by Honorable Patrisha Kaye N. Asugas.
