**MINUTES OF THE 5TH REGULAR SESSION OF THE SANGGUNIANG PANLUNGSOD
(15th CITY COUNCIL) OF PAGADIAN CITY HELD ON 06 AUGUST 2025 AT THE SP
SESSION HALL, 4th FLOOR CITY COMMERCIAL CENTER (C3) BUILDING, PAGADIAN
CITY**

CALL TO ORDER:

Honorable Vice Mayor Monique Shaira Y. To, Presiding Officer, convened and officially called to order the 5th Regular Session of the 15th City Council at 9:20 in the morning.

INVOCATION, SINGING OF THE PHILIPPINE NATIONAL ANTHEM AND RECITATION OF THE “PANUNUMPA SA WATAWAT NG PILIPINAS:

At the instance of Honorable Ma. Alicia Elena V. Ariosa, who now acted as the Floor Leader, the session, accompanied by a prepared audio recording, commenced with the invocation, which was then followed by the mass singing of the Philippine National Anthem, the recitation of the “Panunumpa sa Watawat ng Pilipinas,” the singing of the “Zamboanga del Sur March” and the “Pagadian City Hymn.”

ROLL CALL AND DETERMINATION OF QUORUM:

A roll call was made at the direction of the Chair and quorum was then declared with the attendance of ten (10) Council Members namely: Honorable Vice Mayor Monique Shaira Y. To, Honorable Roger L. Acedillo, Honorable Patrisha Kaye N. Asugas, Honorable Ariel J. Lim, Jr., Honorable Ma. Alicia Elena V. Ariosa, Honorable Ann Marjorie N. Revelo, Honorable Maphilindo Q. Obaob, Honorable Lance Samuel F. Co, Honorable Bienvenido C. Culve, and Honorable Ronald Christopher Glenn L. Ariosa.

Sometime later on during the course of the proceeding, the presence of Honorable Marylynn U. Tan was recorded. The body also noted that Honorable Jackielyn Krystyl C. Bana and Honorable Joan Szanne S. Pulmones were both on leave.

READING AND APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE 4TH REGULAR SESSION:

At the instance of the Honorable Floor Leader, the body dispensed with the Reading of the Minutes of the 4th Regular Session which was held on July 23, 2025. Thereafter, with the presentation of a formal motion for its approval and, with no discussions from the floor, the minutes was approved as presented.

FIRST READING & REFERRAL TO COMMITTEES:

The herein items calendared for First Reading and Referral to Committees were then taken up and acted upon accordingly, to wit:

1. The following Annual Budgets of the barangays were referred to the Committee on Finance & Appropriations:
 - Appropriation Ordinance No. 02, s. 2025 (Supplemental Budget No. 01) of Barangay San Jose, involving an appropriation of One Million Four Hundred Forty-Six Thousand Six Hundred Fifty-Three Pesos and 45/100 (P1,446,653.45).
 - Appropriation Ordinance No. 01, s. 2025 (Annual Budget) of Barangay Macasing, involving an appropriation of Four Million Six Hundred Thousand Pesos (P4,600,000.00).

2. The Unnumbered Draft Ordinance, authored by Honorable Christopher Glenn L. Ariosa, entitled: “An Ordinance Prescribing for Regulations in Addressing and Abating Nuisances Including Noise Pollution in the City of Pagadian,” was referred to the Committee on Public Utilities, Transportation, Communications & Franchising.
3. A joint referral was made for the Unnumbered Draft Ordinance, authored by Honorable Ma. Alicia Elena V. Ariosa, entitled: “An Ordinance Adopting the Pagadian City Tourism Code,” to the Committee on Tourism, Sisterhood Program, Arts & Culture and Committee on Laws, Rules & Policy Formulation.
4. As for the endorsed letter of Mr. Rogelio P. Montealto, Chairman, Zamboanga del Sur Livestock Marketing Cooperative (ZDS-LMC), requesting for accreditation with the City Government of Pagadian, the body resolved to jointly refer the same to the Committee on Education, Science & Technology and Accreditation of NGOs & POs and Committee on Agriculture, Fishery & Agrarian Reform.
5. A joint referral was made for the endorsed electronic letter of Mr. RJ Rix C. Declaro, a resident of Barangay Banale, this City, ventilating his concerns on the unresolved issues of tricycle fare where the tricycle driver demand fare rates beyond what is prescribed in the fare matrix and the traffic congestion in the city, to the Committee on Public Utilities, Transportation, Communications & Franchising and Committee on Laws, Rules & Policy Formulation.
6. The endorsed letter-complaint from the residents of the Pagadian Mutual Executive Heights, situated along north diversion road, this city, relative to health and environmental concerns due to the operation of poultry farm in the vicinity was subjected to a joint referral to the Committee on Laws, Rules & Policy Formulation; Committee on Health & Social Services; Committee on Barangay Affairs; and Committee on Agriculture, Fishery & Agrarian Reform.
7. Next considered was the endorsed Resolution No. 50, s. 2025, from the Joint 3rd Quarterly Meeting of the City Peace and Order Council (CPOC), City Anti-Drug Abuse Council (CADAC) and Local Disaster Risk Reduction & Management Council (LDRRMC), entitled: “A resolution strongly recommending Police Lt. Col. Jerwin Sandiego Cagurin to the ZDS PNP Provincial Director, PCol. Bonifacio Arañas, and NAPOLCOM IX, Acting Regional Director Renato S. Santos as full-fledged PNP Chief of Police in Pagadian City.

Following the information provided by Honorable Obaob that the excellent leadership and performance of Police Lt. Col. Cagurin had contributed a lot to the peace and order situation of the city, the body then suspended the rules to urgently consider the same. After a short deliberation, the body, upon formal motion by Honorable Obaob and duly seconded, resolved to adopt the following resolutions, to wit:

- **Resolution No. 2025-0027**, strongly recommending Police Lieutenant Colonel Jerwin San Diego Cagurin to Police Provincial Director Bonifacio Arañas, Zamboanga del Sur Police Provincial Office, Camp Abelon, Lumbia District, this City, as full-fledged Chief of Police of the Pagadian City Police Station; and
 - **Resolution No. 2025-0028**, strongly recommending Police Lieutenant Colonel Jerwin San Diego Cagurin to Acting Regional Director Renato S. Santos, National Police Commission (NAPOLCOM)–Regional Office IX, as full-fledged Chief of Police of the Pagadian City Police Station.
8. The endorsed Resolution No. 51, S. 2025, from the Joint 3rd Quarterly Meeting of the City Peace and Order Council (CPOC), City Anti-Drug Abuse Council (CADAC) and Local Disaster Risk Reduction & Management Council (LDRRMC), entitled: “A

resolution commending Police Lieutenant Colonel Jerwin San Diego Cagurin, Acting Chief of Police, for his outstanding leadership resulting in the Pagadian City Police Station being adjudged as the Top Performing Component City Police Station in Region IX for the 1st Semester of Calendar Year 2025 was deemed noted and to be put on file as this matter was already acted upon during the previous session.

Along with this action, the Secretary to the Sangguniang Panlungsod was directed to furnish the Pagadian City Peace and Order Council (PCPOC) with a copy of SP Resolution No. 2025-0023, entitled: “A Resolution conveying the body’s congratulations and commendation to the Pagadian City Police Station for being recognized and awarded as “The Top Performing Component City Police Station in the entire Region IX.

9. The Memorandum from the City Local Government Operations Officer, dated July 22, 2025, on the subject: participation in the transformative leadership for elevated governance: Refresher Course for newly elected and re-elected local officials on August 11-12, 2025, with the information from the Honorable Ma. Elena Alicia V. Ariosa that it has been rescheduled to August 14-15, 2025, was deemed noted & filed.
10. A referral was made for the endorsed Resolution No. 01, s. 2025 from the Sangguniang Kabataan of Barangay Kagawasan, approving SK Supplemental Budget No 01, for the priority Programs, Projects and Activities (PPA’s) related to sports development activities to the Committee on Finance & Appropriations.
11. The endorsed Application of Luisa Homes Subdivision for Preliminary Subdivision Development Permit under residential subdivision for Lot No. 1, covered by TCT No. 36, 608, TD No. 2019-002961 and Lot No. 2, covered by TCT No. 39,088, TD No. 2019-001322, with a total land area of 35,182 square meters, situated at Purok Nazareno, Barangay Buenavista, Pagadian City was referred jointly to the Committee on Planning & Landed Estates and Committee on Laws, Rules & Policy Formulation.
12. The endorsed Application of Ms. Rosario M. Tenajeros for a Special Use Permit for a Resort, located at Barangay Datagan, this city, was referred to the Committee on Planning & Landed Estates.
13. As for the Notice from the City Election Officer, Atty. Jed M. Labador, relative to the scheduled continuing voter registration for the December 1, 2025 Barangay and Sangguniang Kabataan Elections on August 1, 2025 to August 10, 2025, Mondays to Sundays including Holidays from 10:00 AM to 7:00 PM at Upper Ground, Robinsons Mall, Pagadian City, the body deemed noted and filed the same. Along with this action, the Secretary to the Sangguniang Panlungsod was directed to furnish City Liga ng mga Barangay through its President, Honorable Joan Szanne S. Pulmones and the City SK Federation President, Honorable Marylynn U. Tan, for their information and guidance.
14. The endorsed request of the City Social Welfare and Development Office for the amendment of SP Resolution No. 2025-1016 in accordance with the title prescribed by the National Authority for Child Care (NACC), was referred to the Committee on Health & Social Services.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Upon resumption after a brief recess, the body unanimously approved the consideration of the herein Committee Reports, and the recommendations contained therein were acted upon as recorded herein, as follows:

1. Committee Report No. 003 from the Committee on Finance and Appropriations, as reported by Honorable Ma. Alicia Elena V. Ariosa, for Referral No. 15cc-0001, led to the passage of **Resolution No. 2025-0029**, declaring Appropriation Ordinance No. 02,

s. 2025 (Supplemental Budget No. 01) of Barangay Bulatok, this City, to be operative and in full force and effect.

2. Committee Report No. 004 from the Committee on Finance and Appropriations, as presented by Honorable Ma. Alicia Elena V. Ariosa, for Referral No. 15cc-0020 facilitated the passage of **Resolution No. 2025-0030**, declaring to be operative in its entirety, Supplemental Budget No. 01, s. 2025, from the Sangguniang Kabataan of Barangay Tuburan, this City, for the Priority Programs, Projects, and Activities (PPA'S) related to the sports and development activities.
3. Committee Report No. 005 from the Committee on Finance and Appropriations, as reported by Honorable Ma. Alicia Elena V. Ariosa, for Referral No. 15cc-0021 led to the passage of **Resolution No. 2025-0031**, declaring to be operative in its entirety, Supplemental Budget No. 01, s. 2025, from the Sangguniang Kabataan of Barangay Gubang, this City, for the Priority Programs, Projects, and Activities (PPA'S) related to the sports and development activities.
4. Next presented was Joint Committee Report No. 006 from the Committees on Infrastructure, Public Bidding and Community Development; on Laws, Rules and Policy formulation; on Police, Fire and Public Safety; and on Public Utilities, Transportation, Communication and Franchising, as reported by Honorable Roger L. Acedillo, for Referral No. 15cc-0041.

Following the query of the Presiding Officer regarding the amendments to the title, a recess was declared. Upon resumption, Draft Ordinance No. 011 is approved for consideration on Second Reading and to be calendared for Second Reading after the conduct of a public hearing.

5. For Committee Report No. 007 from the Committee on Infrastructure, Public Bidding and Community Development, as reported by Honorable Roger L. Acedillo, for Referral No. 15cc-0029, the body, after a brief discussion and, in support of the Committee's recommendation, resolved to pass **Resolution No. 2025-0032**, urging the management of the Pagadian City Water District (PCWD) and the PAMANA to closely coordinate with the Department of Public Works & Highways (DPWH)–First Engineering District, Zamboanga del Sur, the City Engineer's Office, and other concerned agencies relative to any current and future works along the national highway and city roads to avoid further damage, delays or disruption in the implementation of public infrastructure projects.
6. Committee Report No. 008 from the Committee on Ways & Means, as reported by Honorable Ann Marjorie N. Revelo, for Referral No. 15cc-0026, pertaining to Draft Ordinance No. 015, authored by Honorable Revelo, entitled: "An Ordinance Granting Amnesty to all Real Property Taxpayer in the City of Pagadian particularly on the Payment of the Interest, Penalties and Surcharges Incurred from Delinquent Tax Payments/Accounts, Prescribing the Conditions and the Period of Availment Thereof, and In Case of Non-Payment, Authorizing the Utilization of Available Legal Remedies for the Collection of Any and All Taxes Due to the City Government of Pagadian," was approved on First Reading.

Along with the above-mentioned action, Draft Ordinance No. 015 was referred back to the Committee on Ways & Means.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

The body proceeded with the consideration of matters calendared under Unfinished Business, and the following actions are herein recorded, to wit:

1. First considered was Item H-1.1, pertaining to the discussion relative to the alleged removal of vendors and stall owners at the Agora Market, situated at Barangay Santa Lucia, this city, without due process, in relation to the request of the Sangguniang

Barangay of Santa Lucia, as enunciated in its Resolution No. 03, s. 2025, which in gist requested investigation of this matter.

At the instance of the Honorable Floor Leader, the body was then converted into a Committee of the Whole and thereafter the rules were then suspended to allow the personalities, who are present in the vicinity of the session hall, to ventilate their concern.

Upon recognition, Ms. Lolita Dumaboc, President of the Vegetables & Spices Association at the Agora, expressed gratitude to the 15th City Council for giving them the opportunity to express their grievances concerning the manner to which they were treated at the Agora market. Accordingly, she informed the body that last July 26, 2025, the City Administrator—in the person of Mr. Vince Quipot—called for a meeting with the complaining vendors and articulated the various violations they have committed in relation to the provisions of City Ordinance No. 2007–265 otherwise known as the “Revised Guidelines and Policies Governing the Operation and Management of the Newly Restructured City Public Market.”

At this point, the query propounded by Honorable Obaob and further clarified by the Honorable Presiding Officer relative to the commitment made by Mr. Marlon Luzon, designated Market Superintendent, during the previous session relative to the awarding of stalls, prompted Ms. Dumaboc to confirm that five (5) out of the six (6) stall vendors had already been awarded the stalls while the other one (1) was promised with a stall near the fish section which is currently undergoing renovation. On the other hand, Honorable Co, upon recognition, elucidated the method governing the awarding of stalls which is usually done through a raffle to maintain fairness. Further into the discussion, Honorable Co, in consideration of the other issues that were brought up, suggested that it should be referred to an appropriate Committee to study and evaluate the matter.

Honorable Lim, Jr., after verifying that Mr. Luzon is absent in the session hall despite the invitation made in open session, stressed that the issue is not confined to the six (6) identified vendors but rather the 64 transient vendors that were removed or displaced. He then suggested to amend the ordinance due to the alleged violations. Honorable Revelo, for her part, inquired whether the Chairman of the SP Committee on Market & Slaughterhouses/Dressing Plants was invited during the recent awarding of stalls considering the provision of City Ordinance No. 2007–265 which provides that he is a member of the Market Screening Committee, to which Honorable Co intimated that there was no awarding of stalls and clarified that it was just a relocation of stalls which does not necessitate the convening of the Market Screening Committee.

Following a lengthy discussion and, in consideration of the observation from the Honorable Presiding Officer that it is now high time to revisit the said ordinance in view of the various issues surrounding the implementation of the same, the body, after the body was reverted to the plenary, resolved to jointly refer the matter concerning the complaints brought out by the vendors of the Agora relative to the alleged illegal removal of their stalls to Committee on Markets & Slaughterhouse/ Dressing Plants, Committee on Laws, Rules & Policy Formulation and Committee on Ways & Means.

Prior to its referral, Honorable Asugas suggested to invite the Market Superintendent, Mr. Luzon, as well as all the concerned vendors during the scheduled committee meeting.

Finally, the issue raised by Honorable Lim, Jr. on the need to conduct legislative inquiry on the allegation of possible infraction of law committed by the officers and personnel of the Agora Market and the City Economic Enterprise Department in connection with the alleged illegal removal/demolition of the stalls of

the so-called transient vendors, was referred to the Committee on Good Government, Ethics & Civil Service.

2. Next considered was the concern presented by Honorable Ariel J. Lim, Jr. on the actions taken by the Executive Department with regard to the request of the 14th City Council as provided under Resolution No. 2025-1105, dated June 11, 2025, requesting the Honorable City Mayor to direct the City Engineer to urgently prioritize the rehabilitation and/or repair of the damaged and deteriorated road stretch from Barangay Dao up to Barangay Kagawasan, this city.

With the presence of Engr. Joseph Isaias M. Quipot VI, City Administrator and representative of the Office of the City Mayor, in the session hall, the rules were then suspended. Upon recognition, he then provided a brief background information on the status of the foregoing road stretch which was built during the time of the late City Mayor Benjamin Arao way back in the 1990's, where the thickness of the road was just six (6) inches only capable for a light to heavy equipment not exceeding 8-ton capacity. Furthermore, he averred that due to the fast development and progress of the city where there is a significant increase of road users and the motor vehicles got bigger and heavier have greatly contributed to the road's dilapidation. He also informed the body that since 2019, the City Government had started undergoing rehabilitation and road widening thereat by increasing the road thickness from 6 inches to 8 inches but, admittedly, the current budget cannot sustain the repair and rehabilitation of the said road due to insufficient of funds.

During the discussion, the Honorable Ronald Christopher Glenn L. Ariosa recalled that he had previously sponsored a resolution prohibiting the passage of trucks above 8-ton capacity through the barangay roads. He emphasized, that with the current 20-25 tons load capacity of the trucks plying the said roads, the road's structural capacity cannot be sustained since the road was not designed for big trucks. He then suggested that this matter be referred first to an appropriate committee to come up with better inputs. On the matter sought by Honorable Lim, Jr. relative to the list of infrastructure projects included in the Calendar Year 2025 Annual Investment Program (AIP 2025), the City Administrator responded that he is not aware as he then gave assurance that he will personally look into the matter.

Honorable Obaob, on the other hand, sought clarification on the current protocol observed by the Executive Department particularly on the matter of inviting department heads or chiefs of offices as resource persons during committee meeting of the different committees of the Sangguniang Panlungsod, as he narrated the usual practice of sending invitation addressed to the Honorable City Mayor and furnishing copies to the concerned department heads/chiefs of offices for their information and guidance. He also elucidated his recent experience wherein the department heads had refused to receive the copy of the invitation for the reason that all must be coursed through the Office of the City Mayor which resulted to the non-appearance of the invited resource person during the scheduled meeting, which manifestation was supported by Honorable Revelo who experienced similar incident. In response thereto, Engr. Quipot VI, while welcoming the observation, maintained that the invitation must be addressed to the Honorable City Mayor through the concerned department head and furnish the concerned department head/chief of office with a copy of the letter-invitation that was received by the City Mayor's Office.

At this juncture, with no further discussion from the Council Members, the Chair then lifted the suspension of the rules. Following the proposition made by the Honorable Presiding Officer to prioritize the inclusion of the said project in the preparation of the CY 2026 Annual Budget of the City Government, the body, upon formal motion presented by Honorable Co and duly seconded, resolved to adopt the following resolutions, to wit:

- **Resolution No. 2025-0033**, strongly recommends to the Local Finance Committee, through the Honorable City Mayor, to prioritize the inclusion in the Calendar Year 2026 Annual Investment Program of the City Government of Pagadian the funding/allocation for Road Rehabilitation Project from Barangay Dao up to Barangay Danlugan.
- **Resolution No. 2025-0034**, earnestly requesting His Honor, Congressman Joseph Kim C. Yu, Representative–First District of the Province of Zamboanga del Sur, to sponsor a bill in the House of Representatives converting the city road from Barangay Dao up to Barangay Lison Valley, Pagadian City, as Secondary National Highway.

OTHER MATTERS:

For the lone matter calendared under Other Matters, Resolution No. 13, s. 2025, from the Barangay Council of White Beach, entitled: “A resolution requesting the Sangguniang Panlungsod to intervene and mediate in the land conflict between Mr. Danilo F. Detalla and Mr. Ammin Sali Jumah, the body, following the manifestation made by Honorable Ma. Alicia Elena V. Ariosa that the foregoing matter is not within the scope of authority and is beyond the jurisdiction of the Sangguniang Panlungsod, the body, upon her formal motion and duly seconded, resolved to remand to the Barangay Council of White Beach its Resolution No. 13, s. 2025, with a further advise to bring instead the matter to the appropriate agencies through the passage of **Resolution No. 2025-0035**.

UNSCHEDULED MATTERS:

At this juncture, the body then proceeded to tackle the individual concerns of the Council Members under Unscheduled Matters, these were then accorded actions as herein recorded, to wit:

1. The following Draft Resolution Nos. 012, 013 & 014, authored by Honorable Revelo, was urgently considered. Following a brief deliberation, the body, upon her presentation of a separate formal motions and duly seconded, resolved to pass following resolutions, viz:
 - **Resolution No. 2025-0036**, officially declares the Second Week of August of 2025 as “Linggo Ng Kabataan” in the City of Pagadian;
 - **Resolution No. 2025-0037**, requesting the Honorable City Mayor to conduct comprehensive evaluation on the implementation of City Ordinance No. 2024-573, entitled: “An Ordinance Creating The Pagadian City Sports Development Office (PSDO), Under The Office Of The City Mayor, Providing Its Personnel And Composition, Defining Their Duties, Functions And Responsibilities, And For Other Purposes,” and direct the following offices to do and perform the following acts and things, to wit:
 1. The Pagadian City Sports Development Office shall provide/submit to the Sangguniang Panlungsod an accomplishment report including, but not limited to, viz: a) Conducted sports programs and tournaments, training activities for athletes and coaches, partnership with schools and barangays; and b) financial report covering all expenditures; and
 2. The City Budget Office shall allocate necessary funds for the purpose.
 - **Resolution No. 2025-0038**, requesting the Honorable City Mayor to conduct comprehensive evaluation on the implementation of City Ordinance No. 2022-519, entitled: “An Ordinance Promulgating The Guidelines On The Grant Of Monetary Incentives To Any Individual, Pair, Group Or Team, Including Their Respective Coaches Or Trainers, Who Have Been Declared And Ranked Within The Top Three

(3) Winners Of Any Sports, Skills, Arts And Academic Competitions In The Regional, National And International Events And Appropriating Funds Therefor,” as amended by City Ordinance No. 2024-574, and direct the following offices to do and perform the following acts and things, to wit:

1. The City Incentive Committee shall provide/submit to the Sangguniang Panlungsod an evaluation report including, but not limited to, viz: a) Compliance with qualification requirements by grantees; b) Adequacy and timeliness of monetary incentive disbursement; c) The impact of incentives on participant motivation and performance in future competitions; d) Challenges encountered during implementation; and e) Recommendation for potential enhancement or amendment.
 2. The City Budget Office shall allocate necessary funds for the purpose.
2. Draft Resolution No. 015, authored by Honorable Ma. Alicia Elena V. Ariosa, requesting the Honorable City Mayor to increase the MOOE of the Office of the City Vice Mayor, Office of the individual Sangguniang Panlungsod Members, and the Office of the Secretary to the Sangguniang Panlungsod, for CY 2026 Annual Budget of the City Government of Pagadian, was next considered. Following a recess to allow the Council Members discuss the matter informally, the body, after amending the said draft resolution and, on her motion and duly seconded, resolved to pass **Resolution No. 2025-0039**, requesting the Honorable City Mayor to increase in the Calendar Year 2026 Local Expenditure Program of the City Government of Pagadian the budgetary allocation for Maintenance and Other Operating Expenses (MOOE) of the Office of the City Vice Mayor, Offices of the individual Sangguniang Panlungsod Members, and the Office of the Secretary to the Sangguniang Panlungsod.
3. With the rules still suspended, Honorable Co presented the urgent letter-endorsement from the Honorable City Mayor pertaining to the list of proposed infrastructure projects for funding assistance from the President of the Republic of the Philippines with a further request for the passage of a resolution for each particular project. Following a short discussion, the body, in support of the motion of Honorable Co and duly seconded, enacted the following resolutions, to wit:
- **Resolution No. 2025-0040**, earnestly requesting His Excellency, President Ferdinand R. Marcos, Jr., through Honorable Executive Secretary Lucas P. Bersamin, to favorably consider the allocation and/or appropriation of the amount of One Billion One Hundred Million Pesos (P1,100,000,000.00) to fund the Construction/Improvement of the Debok-Lourdes-Lison Valley Farm-To-Market Road, all in the City of Pagadian, Province of Zamboanga del Sur;
 - **Resolution No. 2025-0041**, earnestly requesting His Excellency, President Ferdinand R. Marcos, Jr., through Honorable Executive Secretary Lucas P. Bersamin, to favorably consider the allocation and/or appropriation of the amount of Eight Hundred Million Pesos (P800,000,000.00) to fund the Barangay Road Concreting/Rehabilitation of San Jose-Dao-Bogo-Kagawasan-Danlutan-Tulangan/Datagan Farm-To-Market Road, all in the City of Pagadian, Province of Zamboanga del Sur;
 - **Resolution No. 2025-0042**, earnestly requesting His Excellency, President Ferdinand R. Marcos, Jr., through Honorable Executive Secretary Lucas P. Bersamin, to favorably consider the allocation and/or appropriation of the amount of Fifty Million Pesos (P50,000,000.00) to fund the Barangay Road Concreting/Rehabilitation of Farm-To-Market Road leading to Lourdes Hot Spring, City of Pagadian, Province of Zamboanga del Sur;
 - **Resolution No. 2025-0043**, earnestly requesting His Excellency, President Ferdinand R. Marcos, Jr., through Honorable Executive Secretary Lucas P. Bersamin, to favorably consider the allocation and/or appropriation of the

amount of One Billion Two Hundred Million Pesos (P1,200,000,000.00) to fund the Regional Government Center Concreting of Roads, Sidewalks and Drainages, Slope Protection, Electrification and Amenities Area, situated at Barangay Balintawak, Pagadian City, Province of Zamboanga del Sur;

- **Resolution No. 2025-0044**, earnestly requesting His Excellency, President Ferdinand R. Marcos, Jr., through Honorable Executive Secretary Lucas P. Bersamin, to favorably consider the allocation and/or appropriation of the amount of One Hundred Fifty Million Pesos (P150,000,000.00) to fund the Pagadian City Sanitary Landfill Development at Barangay Buenavista, Pagadian City, Province of Zamboanga del Sur;
 - **Resolution No. 2025-0045**, earnestly requesting His Excellency, President Ferdinand R. Marcos, Jr., through Honorable Executive Secretary Lucas P. Bersamin, to favorably consider the allocation of the amount of Six Hundred Million Pesos (P600,000,000.00) to fund the Establishment of Sardines Processing and Canning Plant in the City of Pagadian, Province of Zamboanga del Sur;
 - **Resolution No. 2025-0046**, earnestly requesting His Excellency, President Ferdinand R. Marcos, Jr., through Honorable Executive Secretary Lucas P. Bersamin, to favorably consider the allocation and/or appropriation of the amount of Eighty Million Pesos (P80,000,000.00) to fund the Rehabilitation/Upgrading of City Slaughterhouse, situated at Barangay Napolan, Pagadian City, Province of Zamboanga del Sur;
 - **Resolution No. 2025-0047**, earnestly requesting His Excellency President Ferdinand R. Marcos, Jr., through Honorable Executive Secretary Lucas P. Bersamin, to favorably consider the allocation and/or appropriation of the amount of One Hundred Fifty Million Pesos (P150,000,000.00) to fund the establishment of Waste-To-Power Development in the City of Pagadian, Province of Zamboanga del Sur;
 - **Resolution No. 2025-0048**, earnestly requesting His Excellency, President Ferdinand R. Marcos, Jr., through Honorable Executive Secretary Lucas P. Bersamin, to favorably consider the allocation and/or appropriation of the amount of Eight Hundred Million Pesos (P800,000,000.00) to fund the Construction of Cement Manufacturing Plant in the City of Pagadian, Province of Zamboanga del Sur;
 - **Resolution No. 2025-0049**, earnestly requesting His Excellency, President Ferdinand R. Marcos, Jr., through Honorable Executive Secretary Lucas P. Bersamin, to favorably consider the allocation and/or appropriation of the amount of Four Hundred Million Pesos (P400,000,000.00) to fund the Construction of Coconut Processing Plant in the City of Pagadian, Province of Zamboanga del Sur; and
 - **Resolution No. 2025-0050**, earnestly requesting His Excellency, President Ferdinand R. Marcos, Jr., through Honorable Executive Secretary Lucas P. Bersamin, to favorably consider the allocation and/or appropriation of the amount of One Billion Two Hundred Million Pesos (P1,200,000,000.00) to fund the Establishment of Agro-Industrial Complex in the City of Pagadian, Province of Zamboanga del Sur.
4. Urgent consideration was made for the following concerns presented by Honorable Obaob. Following a short deliberation, the body, upon his presentation of separate formal motions and duly seconded, resolved to adopt the herein resolutions, to wit:
- On the issue of unserviceable motor vehicles which were haphazardly and arbitrarily parked along the public thoroughfares of the city which has, observably, contributed to traffic congestion and posed serious hazards to motorists and pedestrians alike, the body adopted **Resolution No. 2025-0051**,

requesting the Honorable City Mayor to direct the Chief of Police–Pagadian City Police Station and the Head–Road and Traffic Management Office, Office of the City Mayor, to strictly implement the provisions of City Ordinance No. 2k2–215, entitled: “An Ordinance Removing All Unserviceable Vehicles Parked Along The Highways, Public Thoroughfares, Public Boulevards, Driveways, Avenues, Parks, Streets, Alleys, Sidewalks And/Or Callejons Providing Charges, Storage Fees And Penalties Thereof.”

- On his concern over the recent of fatal vehicular accidents in the City of Pagadian involving motorcycle riders and passengers who were reportedly not wearing the duly approved/standard protective helmets despite the mandatory requirement of wearing a standard protective helmet as required under City Ordinance No. 2018–416 in relation to Republic Act No. 10054, the body adopted **Resolution No. 2025-0052**, requesting the Honorable City Mayor to direct the concerned national and local offices/agencies to strictly enforce the provisions of City Ordinance No. 2018–416, entitled: “An Ordinance Requiring All Drivers And Riders/Passengers Of Motorcycles To Wear The Duly Approved Protective Half-Face Helmet With Uncovered Face While Driving And Imposing Penalty For Violation Thereof,” and all other related national laws.

The passage of the foregoing Resolution shall, in effect, render ineffective and inoperative Resolution No. 2020–0599, enacted by 13th City Council during its 13th Special Session held on 21 July 2020, entitled: “A Resolution temporarily suspending the requirement on the wearing of full-face and/or half-face helmet including the use of non-transparent or colored face mask, tinted face shield, bonnet, cap, hat, visor, shades, eye protector shield and colored eye goggles, for all drivers and riders/passengers of motorcycle while driving within the urban barangays or city proper of Pagadian City, as provided under City Ordinance No. 2018-416, purposely to ensure the face of the motorcycle drivers/riders are clearly visible for convenient identification, except surgical face mask.

5. The proposal of Honorable Ma. Alicia Elena V. Ariosa to consider the attendance and participation of the Sangguniang Panlungsod Members to the Newly Elected Official Seminar at Zamboanga City on August 14-15, 2025 as an official undertaken in lieu of the scheduled regular session on August 13, 2025, and thereby, scheduling the 6th Regular Session of the body to August 20, 2025, the body, on motion by the Honorable Floor Leader and duly seconded, approved the same through **Resolution No. 2025-0053**.
6. Lastly, the issue raised by Honorable Lim, Jr. on the unregulated parking of motor vehicles along the various department stores/malls in the City of Pagadian and his subsequent request for the conduct of study on the matter was jointly referred to the Committee on Public Utilities, Transportation, Communications & Franchising; Committee on Laws, Rules & Policy Formulation; and Committee on Police, Fire & Public Safety.

With no more matters to discuss, the session was declared adjourned on motion of Honorable Ma. Alicia Elena V. Ariosa, following the closing prayer led by Honorable Bienvenido C. Culve.
