**MINUTES OF THE 19TH REGULAR SESSION OF THE SANGGUNIANG PANLUNGSOD
(15th CITY COUNCIL) OF PAGADIAN CITY HELD ON 10 DECEMBER 2025 AT THE SP
SESSION HALL, 4th FLOOR CITY COMMERCIAL CENTER (C3) BUILDING, PAGADIAN
CITY**

CALL TO ORDER:

Honorable Vice Mayor Monique Shaira Y. To, Presiding Officer, convened and officially called to order the 19th Regular Session of the 15th City Council at 9:30 in the morning.

**INVOCATION, SINGING OF THE PHILIPPINE NATIONAL ANTHEM AND RECITATION OF
THE “PANUNUMPA SA WATAWAT NG PILIPINAS:**

Upon motion of the Floor Leader, Honorable Jackielyn Krystyl C. Bana, the session, accompanied by a prepared audio recording, commenced with the invocation, which was then followed by the mass singing of the Philippine National Anthem, the recitation of the “Panunumpa sa Watawat ng Pilipinas,” the singing of the “Zamboanga del Sur March,” and the “Pagadian City Hymn.”

ROLL CALL AND DETERMINATION OF QUORUM:

A roll call was made at the direction of the Chair and quorum was declared with the attendance of twelve (12) Council Members namely: Honorable Vice Mayor Monique Shaira Y. To, Honorable Roger L. Acedillo, Honorable Jackielyn Krystyl C. Bana, Honorable Patrisha Kaye N. Asugas, Honorable Ariel J. Lim, Jr., Honorable Ma. Alicia Elena V. Ariosa, Honorable Ann Marjorie N. Revelo, Honorable Maphilindo Q. Obaob, Honorable Bienvenido C. Culve, Honorable Ronald Christopher Glenn L. Ariosa, Honorable Joan Szanne S. Pulmones, and Honorable Marylynn U. Tan.

Sometime later on during the course of the proceeding, the presence of Honorable Lance Samuel F. Co was recorded as acknowledged by the Chair.

READING AND APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE 18TH REGULAR SESSION:

At the instance of Honorable Jackielyn Krystyl C. Bana, the body dispensed with the Reading of the Minutes of the 18th Regular Session which was held on November 26, 2025. Thereafter, with the presentation of a formal motion for its adoption and, with no discussions from the floor, the minutes was approved as presented.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

With the presence in the Session Hall of all department heads/chiefs of offices of the City Government—who were invited mainly in consideration of the matter under Committee Report—the body, upon motion of the Honorable Floor Leader, then suspended the sequential treatment of the agenda to consider first Committee Report No. 076, from the Committee on Finance and Appropriations, for Referral No. 15cc-0117, which pertains to the endorsed CY 2026 Annual Investment Plan (AIP) for the City of Pagadian with CDC Resolution No. 3, series of 2025, dated October 14, 2025, in the amount of P10,633,244,000.00: Internal Fund of P2,295,000,000.00; and External Fund of P8,338,244,000.00; and CY 2026 Local Expenditure Program of the City Government of Pagadian in the amount of P2,295,000,000.00.

At this point, Honorable Bana, in her capacity as Chairperson of the Committee on Finance & Appropriations, presented the report and gave an overview on the initial findings and recommendations thereto. Thereafter, the body, following a short deliberation, supported the recommendations of the committee through the passage of herein resolutions, to wit:

- **Resolution No. 2025-0178**, approving and adopting the CY 2026 Plans, Programs and Activities and Budget for the Five Percent (5%) Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Fund (LDRRMF) in the total amount of P114,750,000.00, as adopted and included under the Local Expenditure Program of the City Government of Pagadian for Calendar Year 2026 and Itemized/Detailed in the Annual Investment Plan (AIP);
- **Resolution No. 2025-0179**, approving and adopting the CY 2026 Plans, Programs and Activities and Budget for the Five Percent (5%) Gender and Development (GAD) in the total amount of P114,750,000.00, as adopted and included under the Local Expenditure Program of the City Government of Pagadian for Calendar Year 2026 and Itemized/Detailed in the Annual Investment Plan (AIP);
- **Resolution No. 2025-0180**, approving and adopting the CY 2026 Plans, Programs and Activities and Budget for the Twenty Percent (20%) Development Fund (DF) in the total amount of P345,000,000.00, as adopted and included under the Local Expenditure Program of the City Government of Pagadian for Calendar Year 2026 and Itemized/Detailed in the Annual Investment Plan (AIP);
- **Resolution No. 2025-0181**, approving and adopting the CY 2026 Plans, Programs and Activities and Budget for the One Percent (1%) Local Council for the Protection of Children (LCPC) in the total amount of P17,250,000.00, as adopted and included under the Local Expenditure Program of the City Government of Pagadian for Calendar Year 2026 and Itemized/Detailed in the Annual Investment Plan (AIP);
- **Resolution NO. 2025-0182**, approving and adopting the CY 2026 Plans, Programs and Activities and Budget for the One Percent (1%) Senior Citizens (SC) Fund in the total amount of P22,950,000.00, as adopted and included under the Local Expenditure Program of the City Government of Pagadian for Calendar Year 2026 and Itemized/Detailed in the Annual Investment Plan (AIP);
- **Resolution No. 2025-0183**, approving and adopting the CY 2026 Plans, Programs and Activities and Budget for the One Percent (1%) Persons with Disability (PWD) Fund in the total amount of P22,950,000.00, as adopted and included under the Local Expenditure Program of the City Government of Pagadian for Calendar Year 2026 and Itemized/Detailed in the Annual Investment Plan (AIP);
- **Resolution No. 2025-0184**, approving and adopting the CY 2026 Plans, Programs and Activities and Budget for the Local Climate Change Action Plan (LCCAP) Fund in the total amount of P176,250,000.00, as adopted and included under the Local Expenditure Program of the City Government of Pagadian for Calendar Year 2026 and Itemized/Detailed in the Annual Investment Plan (AIP);
- **Resolution No. 2025-0185**, approving and adopting the CY 2026 Plans, Programs and Activities and Budget for the Peace and Order Plan (POP) Fund in the total amount of P175,205,000.00, as adopted and included under the Local Expenditure Program of the City Government of Pagadian for Calendar Year 2026 and Itemized/Detailed in the Annual Investment Plan (AIP);
- **Resolution No. 2025-0186**, approving and adopting the CY 2026 Plans, Programs and Activities and Budget to Combat Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS) in the total amount of P400,000.00, as adopted and included under the Local Expenditure Program of the City Government of Pagadian for Calendar Year 2026 and Itemized/Detailed in the Annual Investment Plan (AIP);
- **Resolution No. 2025-0187**, approving and adopting the CY 2026 Plans, Programs and Activities and Budget for Local Nutrition Action Plan in the total amount of P13,900,000.00, as adopted and included under the Local Expenditure Program of the City Government of Pagadian for Calendar Year 2026 and Itemized/Detailed in the Annual Investment Plan (AIP);
- **Resolution No. 2025-0188**, approving and adopting the CY 2026 Plans, Programs and Activities and Budget for Local Cultural Development Plan in the total amount

of P350,000.00, as adopted and included under the Local Expenditure Program of the City Government of Pagadian for Calendar Year 2026 and Itemized/Detailed in the Annual Investment Plan (AIP);

- **Resolution No. 2025-0189**, approving and adopting the CY 2026 Plans, Programs and Activities and Budget to Address Problems of Illegal Drugs in the total amount of P29,750,000.00, as adopted and included under the Local Expenditure Program of the City Government of Pagadian for Calendar Year 2026 and Itemized/Detailed in the Annual Investment Plan (AIP);
- **Resolution No. 2025-0190**, approving and adopting the CY 2026 Plans, Programs and Activities and Budget to Address Coastal Management in the total amount of P24,350,000.00, as adopted and included under the Local Expenditure Program of the City Government of Pagadian for Calendar Year 2026 and Itemized/Detailed in the Annual Investment Plan (AIP);
- **Resolution No. 2025-0191**, approving and adopting the CY 2026 Plans, Programs and Activities and Budget for Local Youth Development of the City in the total amount of P13,780,000.00, as adopted and included under the Local Expenditure Program of the City Government of Pagadian for Calendar Year 2026 and Itemized/Detailed in the Annual Investment Plan (AIP);

At this juncture, Honorable Asugas was recognized as she expressed her intention to put it on record that her signature only affirms the accuracy of the report and she respectfully manifest that all projects under the External or National Government Agency Funds should have the required SARO which is the Special Allotment Release Order, the Notice of Cash Allotment, and the Memorandum of Agreement from the concerned National Agencies before she gives full support. Although, she clearly intimated that her manifestation is not an objection but rather a reminder to ensure transparency and to protect the LGU and its officials from the possible audit issues from the COA.

With no further discussions from the Council Members, the following resolutions were adopted in support of the motion presented by Honorable Bana, as herein specified, viz:

- **Resolution No. 2025-0192**, approving the Annual Procurement Plan (APP) of the City Government of Pagadian for Calendar Year 2026 in accordance with the CY 2026 Annual Investment Plan;
- **Resolution No. 2025-0193**, approving and adopting the CY 2026 Plans, Programs and Activities to be taken from the External Funds in the total amount of Eight Billion Three Hundred Thirty-Eight Million Two Hundred Forty-Four Thousand Pesos (P8,338,244,000.00), as adopted, included and itemized/detailed in the Annual Investment Plan (AIP) of the City Government of Pagadian for Calendar Year 2026;
- **Resolution No. 2025-0194**, approving and adopting the Annual Investment Plan (AIP) for Calendar Year 2026 of the City Government of Pagadian involving the total amount of Ten Billion Six Hundred Thirty-Three Million Two Hundred Forty-Four Thousand Pesos (P10,633,244,000.00); External Fund, P8,338,244,000.00; and Internal Fund, P2,295,000,000.00; as adopted by the City Development Council through its Resolution No. 03, series of 2025;

Thereafter, the body, upon motion of the Honorable Floor Leader, considered on Second Reading Draft Appropriation Ordinance No. 02, entitled: “An Ordinance Appropriating the Sum of P2,295,000,000.00 as Calendar Year 2026 Budget of the City Government of Pagadian to be taken from the Estimated Income as Certified by the Local Finance Committee to be reasonably collectible.” Following a brief

discussion, the Chair declared a recess to allow the Council Members discuss the matter informally.

Upon resumption at 11:03 a.m., the proposal made by the Honorable Floor Leader to incorporate in the General Provision, as an amendment thereto, the creation of additional Co-Terminus Positions of one (1) Senior Administrative Assistant III (Private Secretary II), Salary Grade 15, in Office of the City Vice Mayor and Twelve (12) Security Agent II, Salary Grade 10, for each of the Sangguniang Panlungsod Member, was carried by the body.

Further into the discussion, Honorable Obaob raised his concern to OIC-City Engineer, Engr. Gloria Samson, pertaining to the submitted comprehensive drainage plan where he contended that the areas of Barangays Sta. Lucia, Balangasan and Dumagoc were considered as the most prone or vulnerable to flooding. He then inquired which areas will be prioritized under the Calendar Year 2026 Annual Budget of the City Government noting that the plan has been divided into four (4) quadrants. At this point, the rules were then suspended to allow Engr. Gloria Samson to ventilate on the issue. Accordingly, she explained that a major portion of the appropriation is allocated for the Sta. Lucia drainage project. She added that for the Jamisola and Manaya Street areas, the plan includes the construction of new drainage outlets, excavating and unclogging drainage canals, and dredging the Gatas River from Manaya Street through Zulueta Street down to the shoreline, as several sections have been compromised due to accumulated waste.

Regarding the query of Honorable Ariel J. Lim Jr. on why the City Pharmacy frequently runs out of medicines and what strategies can be implemented to prevent such shortages, Dr. Debbylene Tan Ildefonso explained that stockouts occur when deliveries for previously issued Purchase Requests are still pending, despite her earlier preparations. As for the delays, Honorable Bana suggested that the City Health Office and the City Pharmacy should coordinate with each other on what medicines are usually needed so they can come up with the bulk amount. On the issue of procurement which is not within the responsibility of the City Health Officer, the City General Services Officer, Ms. Jenny Rose Z. Egama, stressed that there has been no delay on their end although sometimes the deliveries come in batches and not in bulk. She further explained that per quarter it takes 2-4 months for the supplier to make deliveries but under the new government procurement law they can now do away with public bidding and instead make direct acquisition.

Honorable Samuel Lance F. Co, for his part, interjected that the city is hesitant to buy medicines in bulk for the reason that at present storage space is limited, buying in bulk increases the risks of spoilage, rat attacks, and expiration. Added to this, he explained that the length of time for buying in bulk or not is the same as he assured that additional storage space will be provided in the future. At this instance, Honorable Lim expressed his observation that since the city maintains patient records, this database should be utilized to determine the types and quantities of medicines to be procured, emphasizing that this concern should be addressed by the executive department, with the legislative body ready to extend support.

On the other hand, Honorable Obaob expressed elation on the inclusion of the public cemetery and the construction of alternate road from Purok Subida, Barangay Dao going through the upper portion of Barangay Banale downward to help ease traffic congestion which he hopes will be prioritized for implementation in the 1st quarter of 2026.

Engr. Samson, in response to the query of Honorable Culve on the status of the resolution passed by the council for the fabrication and putting up of signs for street names, traffic signages, and directional signages, disclosed that the fabrication of street signs had already undergone bidding, while the rest have been included in

the 2026 Annual Budget. She also explained that the signages will be installed in the areas that already have drainage systems. Further into the discussion, Engr. Samson, in relation to the query of Honorable Revelo as regards the city's biggest project, through power point presented the plans for the new city hall building with a total cost of P500-Million but currently has an initial budget of P10-million only. Thereafter, Honorable Revelo expressed hopes that the project will not have to go through several phases which might result in the building reaching a state of dilapidation before it is completed while Honorable Co shared that efforts will be made so that the relocation/resettlement of the offices of the Justice Hall, Post Office, and PENRO will not disrupt the operations and services of the clientele.

Following a lengthy discussion, the body, upon motion of the Honorable Floor Leader and duly seconded, resolved to approve on Second Reading adopt Draft Appropriation Ordinance No. 02, entitled: "An Ordinance Appropriating the Sum of P2,295,000,000.00 as Calendar Year 2026 Budget of the City Government of Pagadian to be taken from the Estimated Income as Certified by the Local Finance Committee to be reasonably collectible" as amended," and for its consideration on Third and Reading through **Resolution No. 2025-0195**.

A one-minute recess was then declared. Upon resumption, the motion of Honorable Bana and duly seconded, facilitated the adoption of **Resolution No. 2025-0196**, approving on Third Reading Draft Appropriation Ordinance No. 02 and ordaining the same as **Appropriation Ordinance No. 02-12-2025**.

At this juncture, a recess was declared to allow the Council Members and the various department heads and chiefs of offices to have a photo-ops.

FIRST READING & REFERRAL TO COMMITTEES:

Upon resumption, the suspension of the sequential treatment of matters in the agenda was lifted, and the body proceeded with the consideration of the herein items calendared for First Reading and Referral to Committees which were then taken up and acted upon accordingly, to wit:

1. The following Audit Reports for the different Barangays for Calendar Years 2022, 2023 and 2024, issued by the Commission on Audit were deemed noted and filed:
 - Copy furnished Audit Report from the Commission on Audit dated September 26, 2025 of Barangay Kalasan, this City, covering the period from December 31, 2022, 2023 and 2024;
 - Copy furnished Audit Report from the Commission on Audit dated September 26, 2025 of Barangay Manga, this City, covering the period from December 31, 2022, 2023 and 2024;
 - Copy furnished Audit Report from the Commission on Audit dated September 26, 2025 of Barangay Lison Valley, this City, covering the period from December 31, 2022, 2023 and 2024;
 - Copy furnished Audit Report from the Commission on Audit dated September 26, 2025 of Barangay Lenienza, this City, covering the period from December 31, 2022, 2023 and 2024;
 - Copy furnished Audit Report from the Commission on Audit dated September 26, 2025 of Barangay Banale, this City, covering the period from December 31, 2022, 2023 and 2024.
2. A referral was made for the endorsed request of the Honorable City Mayor for an authority to negotiate and purchase additional lot particularly, Lot No. 6053-A, with an area of 20,000 square meters at P400.00 pesos per square meter situated in Barangay Bomba, for the "Asenso Village" Project to the Committee

on Planning and Landed Estates, Housing and Urban/Rural Community Development.

3. The letter-reply of the Honorable City Mayor relative to SP Resolution No. 2025-0104, entitled: “a resolution suspending the implementation of the mandatory change of color of all motorized tricycles-for-hire operating within the City of Pagadian, as required under Resolution No. 2022-1688” was referred to the Committee on Transportation, Road Traffic Management and Franchising.
4. At this point, the following documents were deemed noted and to be put on file, viz:
 - Machine copy of an unnumbered memorandum from the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG), dated November 24, 2025, on the subject: “2025 Local Legislative Awards (LLA), Regional Awarding Ceremony on December 1, 2025 at JayPark Hotel and Convention Center, Lapu-Lapu City.
 - Resolution No. 12-387-2025, from the Sangguniang Panlalawigan of Zamboanga del Sur, entitled: “Adopting Committee Report No. 227-2025, dated November 5, 2025 of the Committee on Appropriations/Finance, Ways and Means, thereby declaring operative in its entirety Appropriation Ordinance No. 1-10-2025 of Pagadian City, Zamboanga del Sur.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

At this point, the following concerns under unfinished business were taken up and the herein actions were recorded, viz:

1. For the concern of the Honorable Members of the 15th City Council pertaining to the Performance Evaluation Report of PAMANA Water Corporation, the body, based on the letter-reply of the PCWD Board that the said report is not yet ready and their request for another scheduled date, resolved to calendar the same on the last scheduled regular session of the Sangguniang Panlungsod on January 28, 2026, which is more than sufficient time for their preparation.
2. Next considered was the concern of the Honorable Members of the 15th City Council relative to the implementation of Section 216 of City Ordinance No. 2018-400, particularly concerning the Collection-Sharing Scheme for the period 2018 to 2024.

During the discussion, Honorable Revelo, upon recognition, gave a brief backgrounder of the matter. Thereafter, the rules were then suspended to allow Atty. Roxan Ortaleza-Tan, Deputy City Administrator, to ventilate on the issue. Initially, Atty. Tan sought for an extension of time so she can deliberate on the matter with the City Chief Executive considering that the foregoing matter was brought to her concern only last Friday, December 5, 2025. Relatedly, she manifested that the City Chief Executive had already allotted funds for the implementors but as to the sharing scheme it was not yet implemented.

At this point, Honorable Lim, Jr. inquired relative to the total amount of collection from the period 2018 up to 2024 to which Ms. Aileen S. Sarcina, OIC–City Treasurer, reasoned that she had not prepared the data as it was not in the invitation, however, her excuse was refuted by the Secretary to the Sanggunian upon reading the letter–invitation.

Upon resumption after a brief recess, the matter was recalendared on January 7, 2026.

UNSCHEDULED COMMITTEE REPORT:

At this point, the body proceeded to treat the unscheduled Committee Reports which were meted the following actions, to wit:

- 1) Committee Report No. 077 from the Ad Hoc Committee, as presented by Honorable Bana, for Referral No. 15cc-0102, which pertains to the Verified Joint Affidavit of Complaint executed by John M. Cajote, et. al., against Punong Barangay Prince Joy I. Gerona of Barangay Lenienza, this City, for dereliction of duty, gross negligence, misconduct, and abuse of authority in violation of Section 60 of the Local Government Code and R.A. 6713 or the Code of Conduct and Ethical Standards for Public Officials and Employees. Based on the finding of probable cause by the concerned Committee and in support of its recommendation, the body adopted **Resolution No. 2025-0197**, converting the 15th City Council into a Committee of the Whole purposely to hear and try SP Admin Case No. 003-2025, entitled: John M. Cajote, et. al., versus Punong Barangay Prince Joy I. Gerona of Barangay Lenienza, for Dereliction of Duty, Gross Negligence, Misconduct and Abuse of Authority in Violation of Section 60 of the Local Government Code or the Code of Conduct and Ethical Standards for Public Officials and Employees.
- 2) Committee Report No. 078 from the Committee on Health and Social Services, as reported by Honorable Lim, for Referral No. 15cc-0140, pertaining to the endorsed request of the Honorable City Mayor, for an authority to sign and accept the Instrument of Donation and Acceptance executed by the Latter-Day Saints Charities-Philippines, Incorporated relative to the donation of medical equipment to the City Health Office. The Honorable Lim presented the list of equipment to be donated, viz:
 - One (1) Dialyses Machine
 - One (1) Dialyses Chair
 - One (1) Ultrasound for Mobile Clinic
 - One (1) X-ray Machine for Mobile Clinic
 - Fifty-four (54) Doppler Device

At this time, Honorable Lim expressed concern over the lack of specialized medical personnel needed to operate the equipment effectively specifically radiologists, ultra sonographers, nephrologists or internal medicine specialists for dialysis, as well as 22 nurses and midwives to complement the 22 barangays who have no available or assigned nurse/midwife. Accordingly, he emphasized that without these professionals, the equipment cannot be utilized to its full capacity, which would greatly reduce its intended health benefits and undermine the benevolent purpose of the donor.

Thereafter, the Committee's recommendations were fully supported by the body through the passage **Resolution No. 2025-0198**, authorizing the Honorable City Mayor to accept, for and in behalf of the City Government of Pagadian, the Donation of One (1) Dialysis Machine; One (1) Electric Dialysis Chair; One (1) Ultrasound Machine for Mobile Clinic; One (1) X-ray Machine for Mobile Clinic and Fifty-Four (54) Portable Doppler Device, from the Latter-Day Saints Charities-Philippines, Incorporated, subject however, to the condition that the City Government shall, either prior or simultaneous on the effectivity of the foregoing deed, hire or contract the services of the following medical personnel to ensure an efficient and effective utilization of the above-mentioned medical instruments, viz:

1. Radiologist;
2. Ultrasonographers;
3. Nephrologist or Internal Medicine Specialist for dialysis; and
4. Twenty-two (22) additional Nurses or Midwives to complement the 22 barangays who have no assigned nurse or midwife to operate the donated portable Doppler Device.

- 3) Committee Report No. 079 from the Committee on Tourism, Sisterhood Program, Arts & Culture, as reported by Honorable Ma. Alicia Elena V. Ariosa, for Referral No. 15cc-0123. The body, following a short deliberation and in consideration of the recommendation of the concerned Committee, approved **Resolution No. 2025-0199**, approving on Second Reading Draft Ordinance No. 021, authored by Honorable Lance Samuel F. Co, entitled: “An Ordinance Creating the Pagadian City Tourism, Culture and Arts Office as a Department of the City Government of Pagadian, Defining its Objectives, Functions, Staffing Patterns, and Appropriating Funds for its operation, and for other purposes,” and for its consideration on Third Reading.

A recess was declared and upon resumption, the motion of Honorable Ma. Alicia Elena V. Ariosa and duly seconded, led to the adoption of **Resolution No. 2025-0200**, approving Draft Ordinance No. 021 on Third Reading and ordaining the same as **City Ordinance No. 2025-622**.

UNSCHEDULED MATTERS:

At this juncture, the body then proceeded to tackle the individual concerns of the Council Members under Unscheduled Matters, these were then accorded actions as herein recorded, to wit:

- 1) The endorsed Supplemental Annual Investment Plan (SAIP) No. 2, for Calendar Year 2025, in the amount of P171,236,500.00 with CDC Resolution No. 5, series of 2025; and Supplemental Budget No. 2 in the amount of P171,236,500.00 which was certified urgent by the Honorable City Mayor was presented by the Honorable Ronald Christopher Glenn L. Ariosa to the body, was referred to the Committee on Finance and Appropriations.

Prior to the above-mentioned action, the body noted the manifestation of Honorable Bana who expressed her dismay over the delayed submission of the foregoing matter by the executive department and imploring the Sangguniang Panlungsod’s immediate action by certifying it as urgent thereby leaving the body with no more space to go over and review the documents.

- 2) The following proposals made by the Honorable Floor Leader were noted:
- ✓ Scheduling the 1st Special Session of the body on December 19, 2025 at 9:00 o’clock in the morning at the SP Session Hall, C3 Building, Barangay Santiago, this city, with the following agenda:
 1.
