



MINUTES OF THE 42ND REGULAR SESSION OF THE SANGGUNIANG PANLUNGSOD (15th CITY COUNCIL) OF PAGADIAN CITY HELD ON 08 JULY 2026 AT THE SP SESSION HALL, 4th FLOOR CITY COMMERCIAL CENTER (C3) BUILDING, PAGADIAN CITY

CALL TO ORDER:

Honorable Vice Mayor Monique Shaira Y. To, Presiding Officer, convened and officially called to order the 42nd Regular Session of the 15th City Council at 9:17 in the morning.

INVOCATION, SINGING OF THE PHILIPPINE NATIONAL ANTHEM AND RECITATION OF THE "PANUNUMPA SA WATAWAT NG PILIPINAS:

At the request of the Floor Leader, Honorable Jackielyn Krystyl C. Bana, the session, accompanied by a prepared audio recording, commenced with the invocation, followed thereafter by the mass singing of the Philippine National Anthem, the recitation of the "Panunumpa sa Watawat ng Pilipinas," the singing of both the "Zamboanga del Sur March" and the "Pagadian City Hymn."

ROLL CALL AND DETERMINATION OF QUORUM:

A roll call was made at the direction of the Chair and only six (6) Council Members were noted present, namely: Honorable Vice Mayor Monique Shaira Y. To, Honorable Roger L. Acedillo, Honorable Jackielyn Krystyl C. Bana, Honorable Maphilindo Q. Obaob, Honorable Bienvenido C. Culve and Honorable Ronald Christopher Glenn L. Ariosa. As this number was insufficient to constitute a quorum, a recess was declared.

The session resumed at 9:39 a.m., and after another roll call was conducted, quorum was then declared with the attendance of eight (8) Council Members through the inclusion of Honorable Joan Szanne S. Pulmones and Honorable Lance Samuel F. Co.

Sometime later on during the course of the proceeding, the presence of Honorable Ma. Alicia Elena V. Ariosa, Honorable Marylynn U. Tan and Honorable Ariel J. Lim, Jr., were recorded as acknowledged by the Chair. The body also took note that Honorable Ann Marjorie N. Revelo and Honorable Patrisha Kaye N. Asugas were both on leave.

READING AND APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE 41ST REGULAR SESSION:

At the instance of the Floor Leader, the body dispensed with the Reading of the Minutes of the 41st Regular Session held on July 1, 2026. Thereafter, with the presentation of a formal motion for its adoption and there being no comments or discussions from the floor, the minutes was approved as presented.

FIRST READING & REFERRAL TO COMMITTEES:

The herein items calendared for First Reading and Referral to Committees were then taken up and acted upon accordingly, to wit:

10 (COA) for the City Government of Pagadian for the year ended December 31, 2025
11 was simply noted and filed with the directive to furnish a copy of the same to the
12 Chairperson of the Committee on Finance and Appropriations.

14 3. The following endorsed Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) to be entered into by
15 and between the City Government of Pagadian with the different hospitals in the
16 city and the request of the Honorable City Mayor for authority to enter into the
17 same were referred to the Committee on Health and Social Services, to wit:

20 Government of Pagadian and the Hofileña Hospital relative to the establishment
21 of a partnership and referral system with other service provider/facilities in order

24 defined under DOH Standard for infirmary, with a further request of the
25 Honorable City Mayor for authority to enter into the same.

27 ➤ Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) to be entered into by and between the City
28 Government of Pagadian and the Mendero Medical Center relative to the
29 establishment of a partnership and referral system with other service
30 provider/facilities in order to improve the delivery or quality health care to
31 patients that cannot be accommodated at the Pagadian City Infirmary due to its
32 limited services as defined under DOH Standard for infirmary, with a further
33 request of the Honorable City Mayor for authority to enter into the same.

35 ➤ Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) to be entered into by and between the City
36 Government of Pagadian and the Aisah Medical Hospital relative to the
37 establishment of a partnership and referral system with other service
38 provider/facilities in order to improve the delivery or quality health care to
39 patients that cannot be accommodated at the Pagadian City Infirmary due to its
40 limited services as defined under DOH Standard for infirmary, with a further
41 request of the Honorable City Mayor for authority to enter into the same.

43 ➤ Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) to be entered into by and between the City
44 Government of Pagadian and the J. Cabahug General Hospital, Inc., relative to
45 the establishment of a partnership and referral system with other service
46 provider/facilities in order to improve the delivery or quality health care to
47 patients that cannot be accommodated at the Pagadian City Infirmary due to its
48 limited services as defined under DOH Standard for infirmary, with a further
49 request of the Honorable City Mayor for authority to enter into the same.

51 4. A referral was made to the Committee on Education, Science and Technology and
52 Accreditation of NGOs and Pos for the copy furnished Memorandum Circular No.
53 2026-037, issued by the Department of the Interior and Local Government, dated
54 June 25, 2026, on the subject: SAFER SCHOOL ZONES (SSZ) under the Safer Cities
55 and Safer Communities’ Initiative.

56
57 5. For the copy furnished advisory from the Department of the Interior and Local
58 Government, dated June 25, 2026, on the subject: “ACCEPTABILITY OF APOSTILLE

- 1 CERTIFICATES ISSUED BY CONTRACTING PARTIES TO THE APOSTILLE
2 CONVENTION”, the body simply noted and put on file the matter.
3
4 6. A referral was made for the endorsed copy furnished Application for Approval of
5 the Emergency Power Supply Agreement between Zamboanga del Sur 1 Electric
6 Cooperative, Incorporated, and Malita Power Incorporated, with Motion for
7 Confidential Treatment of Information, with a further request for the issuance of a
8 Certification with a Dry Seal of the Sanggunian, as proof of receipt of the
9 Application and the date thereof, to the Committee on Public Utilities and
10 Communication/ Information Technology.

12 **COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

13 At this point, the body unanimously approved the consideration of the herein
14 Committee Reports, and the recommendations contained therein were acted upon as
15 recorded herein, as follows:
16

- 17 1. Committee Report No. 185 from the Committee on Infrastructure, Public Bidding and
18 Community Development, Committee on Police, Fire, Public Safety and Illegal Drug
19 Prevention and Committee on Barangay Affairs, as reported by Honorable Roger L.
20 Acedillo, for Referral No. 15cc-0307, which pertains to the verbal concern presented
21 by Honorable Ariel J. Lim, Jr. on the need to conduct an investigation/inspection on
22 the lack of culvert connecting the drainage on the area particularly across the PJC
23 High School at Barangay Balangasan which caused water to overflow during rainy
24 season and endangers the residents and passersby. The body, following a short
25 deliberation made by the Chair, resolved to approve the Committee’s
26 recommendation through the passage of **Resolution No. 2026-0413**, requesting the
27 Honorable City Mayor to direct the City Engineer to conduct a Comprehensive
28 Engineering Assessment of the existing drainage system along the road stretch of
29 De Siete Street, Barangay Balangasan, this city, more particularly the area across the
30 Pagadian Junior College as well as prepare and submit the corresponding Program
31 of Works (POW) for the proposed drainage improvement and culvert connection,
32 evaluate the feasibility of implementing appropriate pedestrian access and safety
33 measures in view of the limited width of the area including the construction of a
34 staircase with steel handrails or other suitable facilities and ensure that all proposed
35 infrastructure improvements are properly integrated into the overall engineering
36 design to effectively address the drainage problem thereat with the end in view of
37 promoting the safety, convenience, and welfare of the general public.
38
39 2. Next considered was Committee Report No. 186 from the Committee on
40 Infrastructure, Public Bidding and Community Development, Committee on Police,
41 Fire, Public Safety and Illegal Drug Prevention and Committee on Health & Social
42 Services, which was likewise reported by Honorable Roger L. Acedillo, for Referral
43 No. 15cc-0308 relative to the verbal concern presented by Honorable Ariel Lim, Jr. on
44 the unfinished construction along the corner of Sabado Street and Jose P. Rizal
45 Avenue which is observably prejudicial to the safety and health of the public. Based
46 on the recommendation of the concerned Committees that the Office of City
47 Engineer had acknowledged it for immediate action, the body then resolved to lay
48 the matter on the table.
49

50 Prior to the above-mentioned action, the Committee expressed willingness to
51 extend legislative support as regards to measures and fundings which manifestation
52 was deemed noted.
53

54 **OTHER MATTERS:**

55 The herein actions were recorded as unanimously adopted by the body to
56 officially dispose of the items calendared under Other Matters, to wit:

- 1 1. Following the approval of the motion for reconsideration presented by Honorable
2 Jackielyn Krystyl C. Bana, Committee Report No. 187 from the Committee on Finance

38 Disturbance Within the Territorial Jurisdiction of Barangay Dao, Pagadian City,”
39 for further study and review.

- 41 The adoption of the above-mentioned resolution was anchored on findings
42 of the concerned Committee that the Barangay Resolution No. 2K26-31 of
43 Barangay Dao does not conform with the provision of City Ordinance No. 2018-
44 411 as well as it does not align with the mandate under DILG Memorandum
45 Circular No. 2026-029.
46
- 47 ➤ Joint Committee Report No. 191 from the Committee on Police, Fire, Public Safety
48 and Illegal Drug Prevention, Committee on Agriculture and Fishery and
49 Committee on Barangay Affairs, for Referral No. 15cc-0299, pertaining to
50 Barangay Ordinance No. 003, s. 2026 from the Barangay Council of Sto. Niño,
51 entitled: “An Ordinance Requiring All Dog Owners to Properly Leash or Restrain
52 Their Dogs in Public Places Within Barangay Sto. Niño, and Providing Penalties

18 Based on the information of the Committee Chair that the request has already
19 been endorsed through a resolution of the City Peace and Order Council (CPOC), the
20 body resolved to note and file the letter request from Col. Lino L. Araya, Jr.
21

22 3. Likewise, the unscheduled Committee Reports presented by Honorable Ariel J. Lim,
23 Jr., was accepted and considered by the body, and the following actions were
24 adopted as herein recorded, viz:

5. At this juncture, the following endorsed letter-request of the Honorable City Mayor for authority to donate, as presented by Honorable Lance Samuel F. Co, were referred to the Committee on Planning & Landed Estates, Housing and Urban/Rural Community, to wit:
- A City Government-owned parcel of land known as Lot 2, Block 1-C of the PRC-MCO Subdivision Plan, containing an area of 3,070 square meters, situated at PCARGC, Barangay Balintawak, this city, in favor of the Military Reservation Army Unit assigned in Pagadian City; and

6. For the concern presented by Honorable Jackielyn Krystyl C. Bana pertaining to the document from a certain Norman M. Ibrahim relative to the approval of the application of the Muslim Village Homeowners Association, Incorporated, to develop a Complex Subdivision Project at Barangay Banale as enunciated in SP Resolution No. 95-003, the body resolved to jointly refer the same to the Committee on Planning & Landed Estates, Housing and Urban/Rural Community and Committee on Laws, Rules & Policy Formulation for proper review.
7. The information relayed by Honorable Obaob on the matter concerning the observation brought out during the Peace and Order Council Meeting pertaining to the accident-prone area along the national highway at Barangay Tiguma particularly fronting the entrance to Camella Homes Subdivision, and the suggestion to study the possibility of establishing a pedestrian lane thereat as well as center barrier of the highway was considered. Thereafter, the body resolved to jointly refer this matter to the Committee on Police, Fire, Public Safety and Illegal Drug Prevention; Committee on Transportation, Road Traffic Management and Franchising; and Committee on Laws, Rules & Policy Formulation.

8. Likewise, another concern presented by Honorable Obaob relative to the previous commitment made by the City Engineer to repair/rehabilitate the portion of the barangay road at Barangay Balangasan leading to Barangay Napolan which, until now, is not yet implemented and it continually poses danger and hazard to the passing motorists. Accordingly, his manifestation was made purposely to make the commitment of the City Engineer be put on record.

CONVENING OF THE BODY AS COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE TO CONSIDER THE FORMAL OFFER OF EXHIBITS FILED BY THE COMPLAINANT AS WELL AS THE FORMAL OBJECTIONS/COMMENT ON THE COMPLAINANTS OFFER OF EXHIBITS AND MANIFESTATION WITH MOTION TO DISMISS AND MOTION FOR RESETTING FILED BY RESPONDENT ON THE ADMINISTRATIVE CASE NO. 004-2026.

At this juncture, the Chair declared a recess. Upon resumption of the session, the body, following the suspension of the rules, and on motion of the Honorable Floor Leader and unanimously seconded, was converted into a Committee of the Whole purposely to consider the formal Offer of Exhibits filed by the Complainant and the formal Objections/Comment on the Complainants Offer of Exhibits filed by the Respondent as well as the Motion to Dismiss and Motion for Resetting filed by the Respondent pertaining to SP Admin Case No. 004-2026, entitled: Punong Barangay Anselmo J. Obedencia versus Arnel L. Cruz, Barangay Kagawad of Barangay Santo Niño, for Conduct Unbecoming of a Public Officer, Gross Neglect of Duty and Inefficiency in Violation of the Local Government Code of 1991.

Upon convening and, following the roll call where it was established that there were eleven (11) Council Members present, the body acting as Committee of the Whole then proceeded to tackle SP Admin Case No. 004-2026.

Shortly thereafter, Honorable Jackielyn Krystyl C. Bana presented to the body, for its consideration, viz: The Formal Offer of Exhibits filed by the Complainant; The Formal Objections/Comment on the Complainants Formal Offer of Exhibits filed by the Counsel of the Respondent; and the Motion to Dismiss and Motion for Resetting filed by the Counsel for the Respondent.

In view thereof, Honorable Maphilindo Q. Obaob, upon recognition by the Chair, presented his recommendations pertaining to the different pleadings filed before the body, and after a brief deliberation from the Council Members, the body approved the recommendations, as recorded hereunder:

- The body deemed noted and filed the Formal Offer of Exhibits filed by the Complainant;
- The Formal Objections/Comment on the complainants Formal Offer of Exhibits filed by the Counsel of the Respondent was likewise noted and filed;
- The body denied the Motion to Dismiss filed by the Counsel for the Respondent, for lack of merit;
- For the Motion for Resetting of the scheduled hearing, the body however grant the same with a stern warning that the body will no longer act or entertain any further motions for postponement or resetting filed before it except on exceptionally compelling grounds.

At this point, the Presiding Officer, in open session, made an Order that the continuation of the hearing of Administrative Case No. SP Admin Case No. 004-2026 is reset on July 15, 2026 at 1:00 P.M. with a stern warning to both parties that no further postponement or any motion to that effect shall be considered except upon exceptionally compelling grounds.

Likewise, the Presiding Officer reminded the individual Council Members on the scheduled date and time of the continuation of hearing on SP Admin Case No. 004-2026.

With no other matters to be taken up by the body acting as Committee of the Whole and, upon formal motion presented by Honorable Bana, the body now is reverted to the plenary.

OTHER MATTERS, CONTINUED:

Upon formal motion presented by the Honorable Floor Leader and unanimously seconded, the earlier decision of the body acting as Committee of the Whole was deemed approved and adopted.

ADJOURNMENT:

With no more matters to discuss, the session was declared adjourned on motion of Honorable Jackielyn Krystyl C. Bana, following the closing prayer led by Honorable Ronald Christopher Glenn L. Ariosa.
